St. Joseph of Arimathea, the Seminary of the Anglican Province of Christ the King, will, once again, offers seminary courses for all postulants, interested clergymen, and laity for the Spring Semester 2020. These courses are designed especially for postulants of the APCK preparing for their canonical examinations, but are also for clergy who wish to take advantage of continuing education and laity seeking to gain a greater knowledge of their Faith. The fee for each course is \$250 (for credit, which includes written assignments, quizzes, and exams) and \$75 to audit (no credit – Pass/Fail). *Limited Scholarships are available on an as needed basis*. Textbooks, if required, can be purchased through Amazon.com or other leading bookseller. **SEMINARY NEWS!** At a recent Council of Bishops meeting, the Council of Bishops appointed The Rev. Canon Ben E. Jones as Vice-Provost of St. Joseph's Seminary. He will also remain as the Seminary's Registrar. Archbishop Upham will assume the duties of President of St. Joseph's and Bishop Donald Ashman will remain as the Seminary's Provost. Bishop Ashman, in a recent edition of <u>*The Shepherd's Staff*</u> wrote, "I would like to personally remind all clergy that "continuing education" is of supreme importance. We

too easily forget what we have learned. We all need to learn what (perhaps) we didn't learn. We all need to sharpen our skills, especially our theological skills."

With Bishop Ashman's words in mind, these courses are offered for Spring, 2020:

#### 1) <u>History of the Church and Development of Doctrine taught by the Rt. Rev.</u> Peter F. Hansen, Bishop Suffragan of the Diocese of the Western States

Bishop Hansen will be offering a two-semester course which will examine elements of Christian History, the effect that the Church had on society, and the errors, inspirations, heroic tales, heresy and orthodoxy, that brought the promise of Christ: *that the Holy Spirit would lead us into all truth*, and how the Church developed its doctrine in that setting. The first semester will cover topics leading up to the brink of the Great Schism. The second semester will cover the Great Schism, the Crusades, the medieval Papal States, the rise of the middle class, the Reformation, Anglicanism as opposed to both Roman and Protestant churches, and subsequent centuries and their challenges that continue until today. <u>Bishop Hansen's course begins TUESDAY, January 7<sup>th</sup> and will meet at 4 pm PST.</u>

## 2) <u>Ecclesiastical Latin VI taught by The Rt. Rev. Donald M. Ashman, Bishop</u> <u>Ordinary of the Diocese of the Western States</u>

Bishop Ashman will continue Ecclesiastical Latin for those who were enrolled previously. He has over thirty years of teaching experience as a high school Latin teacher. He adds that students should not be timid about taking this course. The focus will be not only on Latin Grammar but also on the culture that produced our Church and its Liturgy. Apply yourselves and you too can master Latin! It will serve you well in life! <u>Latin VI</u> will begin Monday, January 20<sup>th</sup> at 10 am PST.

## 3) <u>Biblical Greek II taught by The Rt. Rev. Donald M. Ashman, Rector of the</u> <u>Church of Our Saviour, Los Angeles, CA</u>

Biblical Greek II will continue to focus on the rudiments of learning to read, write, and understand Koine Greek, the language in which the New Testament was originally written. Bishop Ashman has arranged his busy schedule so as to offer this course for those students who would like to be able to read the original biblical language and understand the Scriptures more thoroughly for preaching. Like Latin, Greek is a very valuable tool for those who are engaged with Holy Scripture. <u>Biblical Greek II will begin</u> <u>Thursday, January 9<sup>th</sup> at 3:30 PST.</u>
